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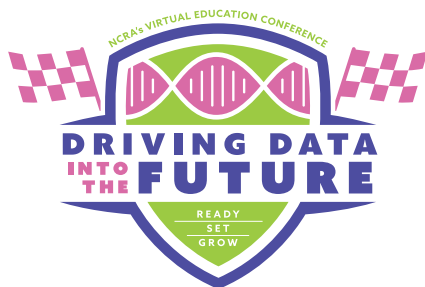

The 2021 Conference Program Committee is excited you are attending NCRA's 2021 Virtual Conference and Exhibit Hall. The Committee has designed a program to provide cancer registrars with critical training to keep current with the ever-changing cancer registry profession.

The conference will kick-off with a keynote address from Jimmy Lin, MD, PhD, MHS, the founder and CEO of Rare Genomics Institute. Dr. Lin will highlight how cancer data have revolutionized the diagnosis of the disease in recent years and review important breakthroughs that are anticipated in the future. In addition, standard setters and key cancer registry partners will provide updates with a live Q&A to answer attendee questions. The second day is centered on in-depth case studies for three disease sites: Hematopoietic, Cervical, and Bladder cancers. Physicians will review the cases in detail and outline how to assign the AJCC TNM stage. Cancer registrars will then demonstrate how to determine the Summary Stage, decide Site-Specific Data Items (SSDIs) and Grade, and determine the application of the Solid Tumor Rules. NCRA has offered a day of case studies at past conferences, and attendees appreciated this type of comprehensive training.

Another popular feature of the 2021 program are four tracks — hospital, central, CoC cancer programs, and registry management — scheduled for Saturday. This targeted format provides opportunities for more in-depth discussions and interactive learning based on a critical cancer registry topic.

Make sure to visit NCRA's Virtual Exhibit Hall. The hall will showcase the newest in cancer registry products and services. Attendees can visit vendor booths for live chats to gather information and have their questions answered by product representatives. 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The Promise of Diagnostics on Cancer Detection, Therapy Selection, and Monitoring

C. Jimmy Lin, MD, PhD, MHS

Founder and CEO, Rare Genomics Institute

Dr. Jimmy Lin is the Founder and CEO of the Rare Genomics Institute, the world's first platform to enable any community to leverage cutting edge biotechnology to advance the understanding of any rare disease. Dr. Lin is also the Chief Scientific Officer (CSO) at Freenome, working on the early diagnoses of cancers. Previously, he was the CSO of Oncology at Natera, where he led the development of new diagnostic technologies for cancer. He also led the ClinOmics program in the Genetics Branch of the National Cancer Institute. Prior to this, Dr. Lin led the computational analysis of the first ever exome sequencing studies of cancer at Johns Hopkins and was a research instructor at Washington University in St. Louis.

Dr. Lin will highlight how cancer data has revolutionized the diagnosis of the disease in recent years and will examine breakthroughs that are anticipated in the future.

He will enlighten attendees on the latest development in liquid biopsy for cancer screening and therapy selection. He prides himself on clarifying opportunities and barriers when it comes to cancer screening. Upon completion, attendees will be able to understand the latest developments in liquid biopsy for cancer screening and therapy selection as well as understand the opportunities and barriers for effective cancer screening.

NCRA's 2021 Virtual Conference is the destination for education in the cancer registry field with three days packed with sessions, case presentations, and exhibitor demonstrations. 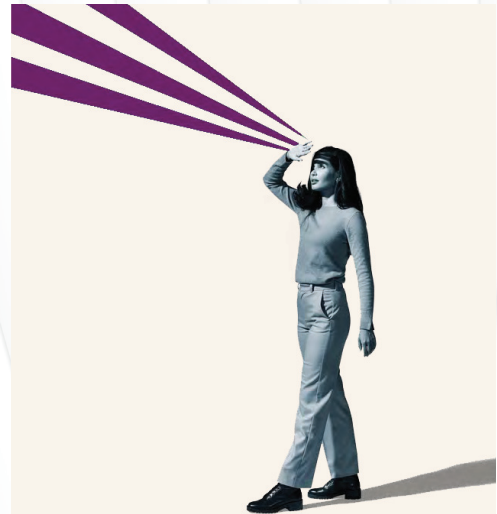
